Before 1990, only two Minnesota pole vaulters had cleared 15 feet, but eight have done it in this decade, and the state record was broken again Saturday by Jed Bergstrom of Buffalo.

Mike Brockwell of Edina had set the record last year when he cleared 15-6 to win the Class AA championship at the Minnesota State High School League meet.

Bergstrom topped that by going 15-61/2 win in the Section 2AA meet.
